Demystifying the Neurological Examination

The first part of the session is called "Demystifying the Neurological Examination". Many people find the neurological examination to be daunting and mysterious. This talk will cover a simplification of the neurological examination and its relevance to the clinical patient. The second part of the session, "Interesting Intracranial Diseases of the Dog and Cat," will review granulomatous meningoencephalitis (GME), breed-specific meningitis (Pug, Maltese, Yorkshire Terrier), and Feline Ischemic Encephalopathy. The review will cover the pathogenesis, clinical examination findings, diagnosis, and treatment recommendations. Throughout the lecture, case examples will be used to practice making neuroanatomic localizations.
